How to check your battery health on iOS

No matter how well you take care of a device, your battery's health will slowly deteriorate over time. Here's how to quickly check the health on your iPhone's battery.

A low-maximum capacity battery will hold less of a charge, requiring you to charge it more often. A battery that has very low health will need to be replaced (less than 80%).

If you've got an iPhone, you can easily check your battery health by following the steps below.

1. Open **Settings**
2. Tap **Battery**
3. Tap **Battery Health**




How to get rain notifications in iOS 16

It's no fun getting caught in the rain, and Apple knows this. Here's how to stay dry with the help of Apple's Weather app and its handy precipitation alert feature.

Apple's Weather app comes with an excellent feature called "Next Hour Precipitation." Properly configured, the feature will alert you when there's a decent chance of rainfall in your area.

1. Open **Weather**
2. In the lower-right corner, tap the **List icon** 
3. In the top right corner, tap. 
4. Tap **Notifications**
5. Tap on the location you want to view
6. Toggle on **Next-Hour Precipitation**



What can Siri do?



Use Siri to answer questions

Use Siri to quickly check facts, do calculations, or translate a phrase into another language. Say something like:

- “Hey Siri, what causes a rainbow?”
- “Hey Siri, what does a cat sound like?”
- “Hey Siri, what’s the derivative of cosine x?”
- “Hey Siri, how do you say Thank You in Mandarin?”

Use Siri with apps



You can use Siri to control apps with your voice. Say something like:

- “Hey Siri, set up a meeting with Gordon at 9” to create an event in Calendar.
- “Hey Siri, add artichokes to my groceries list” to add an item to Reminders.
- “Hey Siri, send a message to PoChun saying love you heart emoji” to text with Messages.
- “Hey Siri, what’s my update?” to get an update about the weather in your area, the news, your reminders and calendar events, and more.

Use Siri to share information with contacts

You can share onscreen items like photos, webpages, content from Apple Music or Apple Podcasts, Maps locations, and more with people in your contacts.

For example, when looking at a photo in your Photo library, say something like “Hey Siri, send this to mom” to create a new message with the photo.
