How to use Visual Look Up on iPhone and iPad

Visual Look Up uses machine learning and intelligence to give users information on various objects, places, animals, flowers and plants, and more in their pictures in the Photos app. It's a really useful tool that comes in handy when you want information instantly.

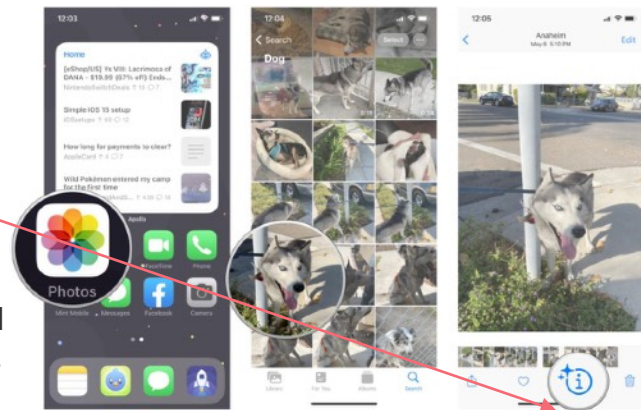
The feature helps people learn more about what they have photographed and is particularly handy when you don't know what insect, bird, object you've found in the wild. Here's how to use Visual Look Up on iPhone and iPad.

The one requirement for Visual Look Up is that the device needs to have at least an A12 Bionic chip, which eliminates older models. Here is the full list of compatible A12 and later devices:

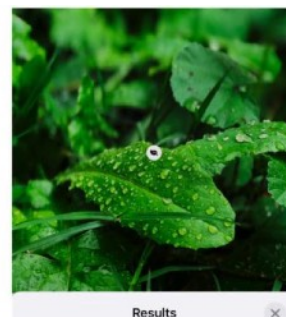
iPhone XS and later, iPad 8th generation and later, iPad Air 3rd generation and later, iPad mini 5th generation and later and iPad Pro 2018 and later.

How to use Visual Look up

1. Launch Photos on your iPhone or iPad
2. Look for a photo that has sparkly stars on the 'i' button
3. Tap the "i" button when it has the sparkly stars on it.
4. This brings up the information panel, and you should see a Visual Look Up button on the image itself. It will have a different icon on it depending on what it is. For example, if it is an animal, you will see a paw print.



5. Tap the Visual Look Up button and it should bring up results that you can look at.



How to change your Apple Watch Band

Since the product's inception in 2015, Apple Watch models have looked quite similar, which means that your watch band is the best way to make your watch stand out.

A band and watch face are your customization options to give your Apple Watch a sense of personality, to make it your own.

Apple has provided a wide range of official bands to help you personalize your watch.

If you find them a bit pricey for your tastes because none are remotely cheap? While Apple uses a proprietary fastening system, countless third-party companies have produced budget — and not-so-budget — options for those willing to look a little further afield.

Switching out a band only takes a few seconds. But if you've found yourself confounded by Apple's band system, and worried about damaging your band by forcing the thing out, here's how you change an Apple Watch band painlessly.

1. Place your watch screen down and take note of which side has the longer part of the band attached to avoid putting the new strap in the wrong way around
2. Press the little button that sits by one half of the band and slide that band piece out sideways, not away from the watch. A fingernail should suffice to press the button
3. Repeat that process for the other side of the band
4. Take one-half of the new band and look at the fastener bar at the end. The "up" side will have a little part that pokes out slightly in the middle of this fastener bar
5. Slide the band into the Apple Watch sideways. It doesn't matter from which side. Move it in slowly until you feel a little click, signifying it is in place. **Repeat** for the other half of your strap.....



It's always better to shop around to find what you might want!
