

# **iPhone Photos Fun (iOS 16)**

*(Note: These Tips are available on iOS 16, which you can download as long as you have an iPhone 8 or newer.)*

## **I. A Hidden Photo Tool Is Embedded in iOS 16 (That's Like Photoshop for Your iPhone) ...**

- 1. Open the Photos app on your iPhone ...**
- 2. Tap Albums at the bottom of your screen ...**
- 3. Tap Recents, Find a Photo Object to Extract and Tap, Hold, And Let Go and Tap “Copy” ...**
- 4. Tap “Copy” ...**
- 5. (For Example) ...Open Notes, and Tap (Box with Pencil) For a New Note ...**
- 6. Tap In New Note, then Tap “Paste”. (Note: To Paste Your Extracted Segment in another App.)**

## **II. How to Take a Photo Using the iPhone Volume Buttons ...**

- 1. Open the Camera app ...**
- 2. Select which Camera Option you want to use ...**
- 3. When you're ready to take a photo (or start one of the Video Options), Press either the Volume Up or Volume Down Button. (Note: The volume buttons are located on the side of your iPhone. Now you can snap photos using the volume buttons. You can hold your phone either vertically or horizontally, whichever works best for you. Enjoy taking selfies without any more awkward finger stretching!)**

## **III. How to Convert “Live Photos” into Videos ...**

- 1. Open the Photos app on your iPhone ...**
- 2. Tap Albums at the bottom of your screen ...**
- 3. Scroll Down to Media Types > Live Photos and Tap Live Photos ...**
- 4. Tap “Select” and Tap All of the “Live Photos” for your Video ...**
- 5. Tap the Circle with 3 Dots (...), then Tap “Save as Video” ...**
- 6. Tap Media Types >Videos to View the new Video.**

## **IV. How to Take an iPhone Scrolling Screenshot ...**

- 1. Open the Web Page and Article in Safari that you'd like to Capture and Take a Normal Screenshot (Note: If you want to delete the ads, Tap the “AA” at the web address line, and Tap “Show Reader” before you take the screenshot!) ...**
- 2. Tap the Screenshot Preview that pops up in the lower-left corner ...**
- 3. Tap “Full Page” at the top of your screen, then Tap “Done” ...**

- 4. You'll be given the Options to "Save PDF to Files", "Delete Screenshot", or "Cancel"...**
- 5. Tap "Save PDF to Files" to Save your Scrolling Screenshot.**

## **V. How to Use Portrait Mode on iPhone ...**

- 1. Open the Camera app ...**
- 2. Tap "Portrait" in the menu above the Shutter button ...**
- 3. Select your Photo Lighting. There are several choices, including Natural Light, Stage Light, or Black & White options ...**
- 4. If you're too Far Away from your subject, your iPhone will say "Move Closer;" ... Move Closer until the notification Disappears.**
- 5. Tap the Shutter Button when you're ready to take your photo.**

## **VI. How To Preview Photos While You Are in the Camera App ...**

- 1. Open the Camera app and Take a Picture...**
- 2. Tap the Thumbnail of the Photo, Bottom Left Corner to View It ...**
- 3. Edit from Here or Edit, Swipe Back & Forth to View other Pictures**
- 4. To return to the Camera app, simply Tap the Back Arrow.**

## **VII. How to Scan Photos Using the Notes App ...**

- 1. Open the Notes app**
- 2. Tap the Create New Note icon (Square with Up-Arrow) in the Bottom-Right Corner ...**
- 3. Tap the Plus icon for the Options Menu, Tap Camera icon ...**
- 4. Tap "Scan Documents" & Set Auto/Manual to "Manual" ...**
- 5. Tap the Shutter Button to Scan the Photo ...**
- 6. Crop by Dragging the Corners to meet the Edges of the Photo ...**
- 7. Select Keep Scan or Tap Retake if you need to try again ...**
- 8. Tap Done at the Upper-Right Corner to Save the Picture ...**
- 9. Tap Picture, Tap 3-Circles icon to Select Photo Mode.**
