

Many Features, Tips, and Fun Stuff in ... iPhone (iOS 17)

How to Share a Slideshow on a iPhone ...

1. On your iPhone, **Open** the “Photos” App ...
 - **Tap** “Albums” ...
 - **Open** the “Album” you want to **Turn Into** a Slideshow ...
 - **Tap** the “3-Dots-Circle” at the **Top Right** ...
 - **Tap** the “Play Memory Video” ...
 - **Tap** the “Screen” as the **Video is Playing** to **Bring Up** the Menu ...
 - **Press** the “Pause Button” to **Pause** the Video ...
 - If you're **Happy** with the Slideshow, **Tap** the “Share Button” ...
 - To **AirDrop** the video on the **Same Wi-Fi** as you, **Tap** the **AirDrop Button** ...
 - To **Save** it as a Video, **Tap** Save Video, or **Send** It via Email or Messages.

Use Haptic Touch (Long-Press) to Preview an Email ...

2. **Open** the Mail App ...
 - **Long-Press** on an Email ...
 - You will see a **Menu** that **Allows** you to **Access** most of the “Controls”, the **First Row** is “Reply”, “Reply All”, and “Forward” ...
 - From here, you can **Tap**: “Mark”, or **Tap**: “Notify Me”, “Mute”, “Move Message”, “Trash Message” or “Block Sender” ...
 - If you **Tap**: “Mark” you can then Select **Flag**, “Mark as Unread,” or “Move to Junk”.

How to Enable Reader View in Safari on iPhone ...

3. **Open** “Safari” and **Navigate** to the **Page** you want to **Read...**
 - **Tap** the “AA icon” ...
 - **Tap** “Show Reader” (*The page will change to Safari's reading mode, eliminating any ads and other stuff.*) ...
 - (**Note:** *If Reader is grayed out, it means the page does not work with Safari Reader.*)
 - The “AA icon” will now **Be Black** to **Show** that “Reader View” is **Active**. **Tap** the **Icon** again to **See** “More Reader View Options” ...
 - **Choose** a “Location on your iCloud Account” to **Save** the “PDF” ...
 - You can then **Change**: Background Color, Font Style, and Font Size.

How to Auto Delete Old Text Messages on iPhone ...

4. **Open** Settings, and **Select** Messages ...
 - **Under** “Message History”, **Tap** **Keep Messages** ...
 - Your “Options” are “30 Days”, “1 Year”, and “Forever” ...

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- *(Note: If you select 30 Days or 1 Year, a warning will pop up telling you that “Enabling this setting will permanently remove all messages older than 30 days or 1 year”) ...*
- Once you **Tap** the “Delete Button”, all your older messages are premaritally lost.

How to Mass Delete Text Messages on iPhone ...

5. **Open** any Text Conversation in the Messages App ...

- **Long Press** on Any Message, then **Tap More** ...
- **Circles Slide In** from the **Left Edge** of the **Screen** for **Each Message** ...
- Then, **Tap** a **Circle**, and it'll **Turn Blue** with a **Checkmark** in the **Middle** ...
- **Check Off** as many **Messages** as you want **Delete** ...
- **Tap** the **Trash Can Icon** in the **Lower Left** ...
- **Tap Delete Message**.
- *(Note: Quickly clear up your messages by getting rid of messages you don't need anymore. You can delete individual messages without deleting the whole conversation.)*

Scan a Document on iPhone with the Files App ...

6. **Open** the Files App ...

- **Tap** the “Three Dot Menu Button” in the “Top Right Corner” ...
- And **Select** “Scan Documents” ...
- **Move** the “iPhone” **Over** the **Document** you want to **Scan**, once the **App Detects a Document**, it **Automatically Snaps a Photo**, you can also **Tap** the **Auto Button** in the **Upper Right Corner** to **Manual** and then **Tap** the “Shutter Button” ...
- If you want to **Keep** the **Document**, U “Keep Scan”.
- Once you've **Scanned** All your **Document(s)**, **Tap** “Save (x)” ...
- You may need to **Choose** the **Folder** where you want to **Save** your **Scanned Document**. If so, **Choose** the **Folder**, and **Tap Save** in the **Top Right Corner** ...
- **Tap** the **icon** of the **Document** to **See** your **Scanned Document**.

How to Send Balloons (And Stuff) on iPhone ...

7. **Open** the Messages App ...

- **Start** a **New Message** ...
- **Enter** the **Name** of **At Least** “One Recipient” ...
- *(Note: If you are **Starting** a **New Message** to “Another iPhone User” the “Users Name” will **Print in “Blue”**, which **Confirms** that the **Recipient** will be able to see your screen effects. If you selected an existing conversation, **Check** for **Blue Text Message Bubbles**, which **Confirms** the other person can **See** your **iMessage Effects**.) ...*
- **Type** your **Text Message** ...
- Then **Long Press** the **Arrow** for at **Least One Second** ...

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- **Tap Top Left** of the “**Screen**” Option at the **Top** of the **Screen** to **Access** “**Full-Screen Effects**” ...
- **Swipe** from the **Right Side** of the **Screen** to the **Left** to **Scroll Through the Different Screen Effects** ’til you get to the **Balloon Option**, or one you want...
- (*Note: You can also **Modify** the **Message Bubble** which has **4 Different Types** of **Message Bubbles: Invisible Ink, Gentle, Loud, and Slam. Choose One** of the **4 Bubble Options** and **Tap** on the **Blue Arrow** to **Send your Message.**)*

How To Take a Screenshot on Your iPhone ...

8. Get to the iPhone Screen you Want to Capture ...

- **Simultaneously Press** the **Sleep/Wake Button** on the **Right-Hand Side**, and the **Volume Up Button** on the **Left Side**, and **Quickly Release Both Buttons** ...
- When you **See** the **Screen Flash White** (and possibly **Hear the Camera Shutter**), the **Screenshot** has been **Captured** and **Appears** in the **Lower Left Section** of your **iPhone** for about **5 seconds** ...
- If you **Immediately Tap** on the **Thumbnail Image**, the **Captured Image Appears** on **Another Screen** where you can **Resize, Add Comments, Send it Somewhere, Etc.** ...
- When you are **Finished, Tap Done** and **Select** your **Option** from the **Pop-Up List** ...
- If you **Don't Tap** the **Lower Left-Hand Thumbnail Image Immediately**, then the **Photo** is **Added Directly** to the **Photos App**.

How to Cut Out an Image from a Photo on iPhone

9. Open the Photos App ...

- **Select** a **Photo** you'd like to **Cut Out** an **Image From**. (*Make sure it's an **Image** with a **Clear Subject** that **Doesn't Blend** into the **Background** too much.) ...*
- **Tap** on the **Subject, Hold Briefly**, and then **Release**. You will see the **Object Outlined** in **Silver**. Then **Tap ... Copy, Look Up, Add Sticker, or Share** ...
- You can **Paste** these isolated subjects in **Messages, Emails, Notes**, and anywhere else you might include a photo. (*You Can't Paste them on top of other photos without photo editing software, unless you Make the Images Stickers!*) ...

How to Turn On Flash Notification on iPhone

10. Open the Settings App and Tap Accessibilities ...

- **Tap** “**Audio & Visual**” ...
- **Select** “**LED Flash for Alerts**”.
- **Tap** the **Toggle** Next to “**LED Flash for Alerts**” to **Enable** this Feature ...
- (*By Default, the **LED** only **Flashes** if your **iPhone Locked** and the **Ringer** is **On.**)*
- However, **Set** these **Two Toggles: “Flash when Unlocked”** and “**Flash in Silent Mode**” to **Allow ...** and you will enable both **flashes to also Flash**.
