Tips to Extend Your iPhone's Battery Life

Disable Haptic Keyboard Feedback

If you've turned on the keyboard option that provides haptic feedback when you tap the on-screen keys, you might want to turn it off temporarily because it can affect battery life. Here's how to turn it off:

- Open up the Settings app.
- Tap on Sounds & Haptics.
- Tap on Keyboard Feedback.
- Toggle off Haptic.

Turn Off Proximity AirDrop Sharing

To do so, go to Settings > General > AirDrop and toggle off "Bringing Devices Together."

Use Offline Maps

If you're traveling somewhere, before you go you can save some battery life if you download Apple Maps for offline usage, a feature available on iPhones running iOS 17 or later. If you down load your trips Apple map is as simple as searching for a location, tapping on the download button, and selecting the area of the map to download.

Turn Off Live Activities

Live Activities let apps keep an ongoing notification on the Lock Screen or in the Dynamic Island, which can cause noticeable battery drain. Live Activities can be disabled by following these steps:

- Open up the Settings app.
- Go to Face ID & Passcode.
- Enter your passcode to unlock the iPhone.
- Scroll down and toggle off Live Activities.
- There are many more ways to extend battery life go to the "Maximize Battery Life" item on the right and click on it for more information.

macOS Sonoma

Planning to update your Mac to the latest operating system? First see if you computer is compatible. Under the Apple Logo in the upper left corner of the screen click on "About your Mac" then see if it is one of the follow:

- 2019 iMac and later
- 2018 MacBook Air and later
- 2018 MacBook Pro and later
- 2019 Mac Pro and later
- 2018 Mac mini and later
- 2017 iMac Pro
- All Mac Studio models



The clubs support team has determined that macOS Sonoma is safe to install on computers with the Apple Silicon processors (M1, M2, and M3).

If you have an older mac with an Intel processor, please call the help line before you attempt to install macOS Sonoma.

These Sonoma features require some flavor of Apple Silicon M1, M2 or M3 processor:

- The "Presenter Overlay" mode for video calls.
- Game Mode, which promises to limit background tasks and reduce Bluetooth latency.
- High-performance mode in the Screen Sharing app.
- Getting rid of the "Hey" in "Hey Siri."
- Running games built with the Game Porting Toolkit.

These features join the list of features from previous releases that only worked on Apple Silicon Macs, including:

- Running iOS/iPadOS apps.
- Spatial Audio in FaceTime when using AirPods.
- The 3D globe and more detailed renderings of cities in Apple Maps.
- On-device voice dictation, with no Internet connection required and no time limit.
